Digraph and Consonant Blend Lessons

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Note to Teachers and Tutors.

My desire in writing this book is to see Somali adults acquire and use English in a way that will help them flourish in their new home land of America. They will truly flourish when they come to know the Giver of Life. It is with this in mind that I have integrated scripture in both English and Somali into the lessons.

All English scripture portions are taken from the NIrV or the NIV.

Most books for teaching English to non-native speakers are written with the assumption that learners come from a literate background in their primary language. Even those books written for "pre-literate students" often focus on sight word recognition rather than increasing a student's confidence in their ability to sound out new words.

Beyond ABC is designed for students coming from a pre-literate background, who have already learned letter names and single letter sound correspondence for consonants and short vowels. They are ready to begin putting the letters they know together in sound clusters and practicing sounding out words they see. The book will also prove useful for more advanced students who may have a larger sight-word vocabulary, or greater fluency in speaking and listening, but who would benefit from word decoding skills to give them greater confidence in their reading ability.

Lessons are designed so that they may be used in either classroom groups or with one-on-one tutoring. Lessons include a variety of activities. Teachers and tutors are encouraged to use the combination of activities that are most helpful for each individual student. Some students may need to repeat and review the vocabulary in a variety of ways before proceeding to the writing lesson; others may quickly learn—vocabulary but need guidance with letter formation and handwriting. Scripture containing the target sound cluster is included to encourage spiritual conversations.

Teaching Suggestions

Introducing a new sound

Write the blend or digraph combination on the board. Say the corresponding sound for each letter and have students repeat after you. Say the corresponding sound for the blend or digraph. Have students practice the two letters independently and in combination. B, [b], L, [l], BL, [bl].

Vocabulary and Word Decoding

Introduce one picture at a time. Ask the students try and guess the first word. If students do not know, say the word and have students repeat after you. Add a second word. When students can identify both words add a third. Keep adding words one at a time while reviewing the previous words. Practice saying the words and pointing until students are able to identify the pictures by pointing when you say the word and by saying the word when you point to a picture.

Introduce the written words, one at a time. Say the whole word, break it into chunks (i.e. "stop, st-o-p") while isolating each chunk. Cover the other parts of the word with your hand. Have students write the target sound in the blanks. Practice breaking the word apart and putting it back together.

Use the chart to practice saying each sound, putting sounds together to form syllables, and then saying the whole word

Matching

Have students point to each word and say the word. Next have students point to each picture and identify the picture. Students should then underline the target letter cluster in each word. Finally students should write the word under the correct picture.

Handwriting

Students should read and say each word before copying. Students should trace each word and then copy it three or more times. Focus on correct use of upper and lower case letters and spacing on the page (below the dotted line, above the dotted line, filling the whole space, etc.). Have students underline the target blend or digraph and circle their best writing.

Scripture

Read the English scripture passage to the student. Ask the student to listen for the target sound. Have student scan the verse and point to the letters forming target sound. Ask the student to point to high frequency word in the passage. (is, the, have, etc.) Work with the student to sound out and read the Somali scripture, if the student is a Somali speaker. Ask the student to explain the passage to you. Use gestures, pantomime, drawings, to help student gain understanding of the passage. Take time to discuss the passage at your student's level of English comprehension. Have student copy the passage in English and also Somali if the student is a Somali speaker. Practice reading the passage with the student. Have student read one word at a time, pointing to each word. Break multiple syllable words into syllables. Break the passage into short phrases, and have the student read each phrase. Read the whole passage, repeating the steps as needed until student is able to read it fluently.

This is a great opportunity for tutors to become students as you attempt sounding out Somali words. Somali is very regular in pronunciation. With consonants being similar to English and vowels like those of Spanish. Exceptions to note are the letters C and X which have sounds we don't use in English. The Somali C is a glottal stop, closing the back of the throat. The X is like h, but with extra push from deep in the diaphragm. The challenge you may have with these sounds is similar to that faced by your students as they say th or distinguish between p and p. Have fun learning together.

Review

At the beginning of each teaching session, take time to review previous lessons. Repeat the decoding (Point and Say) activities. Use note cards to have students create their own flashcards. Mix the word cards from previous lessons and have students sort them in to groups by target letter clusters. Have students arrange cards alphabetically.
